Turkey withdraws from the İstanbul Convention!

Turkey declared to withdraw from the İstanbul Convention with the decree published in the Official Gazette on March After the decision, many feminist and LGBTI+ organization called for street in different actions cities. Women and LGBTI+s gathered in Sakarya Square on March 20 in Ankara. In Antalya, police tried to prevent the rainbow flag from entering the demonstration area during the İstanbul Convention protest held on March 20th. The police attacked the rainbow flag and took it. After the flag was confiscated, the women held a sit-in until the flag is returned. The police kicked a woman in the meanwhile.

Police banned LGBTI+ signs in 8th March protests and detained trans women

A rally was held today (March 6) at Kadıköy upon the call of the İstanbul March 8 Women's Platform. After the <u>arbitrary and discriminatory ban order against rainbow flags at the March 8 demonstrations in Adana</u>, although the Governorate of İstanbul did not publicly announce any ban, the police tried to take away the rainbow flags and even the rainbow-colored umbrellas from the protestors.

After the end of the rally, the police forces followed the trans women LGBTI+ activists, including Yıldız İdil Şen who gave a speech at the rally, stopped their taxi and forced them out of the car by using excessive force. Three trans women were ambushed on the road to their homes and even the persons who tried to record the incident were battered and detained.

The prosecution sent 9 people to the court with a request for arrest without even taking a statement. In the interrogation, the detainees stated that the police detained them by torture, and that they especially targeted and discriminated the trans people. The judge ordered https://example.com/house-arrest-for-one-month-for-Yıldız İdil Şen-and-Güneş. All those detained have been sentenced to the injunction of biweekly signature and a ban on leaving the country.



Rainbow Scenes from 8th of March Demonstrations

Systematic criminalization attempts over rainbow flag in Boğaziçi protests

Boğaziçi University has <u>launched a disciplinary investigation</u> into a student carrying a rainbow flag during protests against the appointment of a rector. N.D., who raised a rainbow flag during protests attacked by police on February 1, targeted by a disciplinary investigation that says "you went upstairs and waved the LGBTI+ flag". On March 25, <u>four students were detained</u> in the Hisarüstüstu Neighborhood, where the Boğaziçi University is located, on the grounds that they were "carrying an LGBTI+ flag". *Police* also attacked and detained students protesting the detention of their friends.

"LGBT" becomes a swearword in the mouths of the business world

"LGBT", not mentioned by TUSIAD (Turkish Industry and Business Association) during their statement against the withdrawal from the İstanbul Convention, turns into hate speech in the mouths of Anatolian Lions Businesspeople. The President of the Anatolian Lions Businessmen's Association, who expressed his thanks to the President "for our withdrawal from the İstanbul Convention", continues with the statement "we are the custodians of the women by the will of Allah" after a homophobic hate speech session.

Statement from Kaos GL: You can't make "reforms" for human rights while excluding LGBTI+s

Kaos GL Association published a press release regarding the announced human rights reform plan. The association said that the LGBTI+ exclusionary plan is discriminatory from its very beginning and is not a human rights reform in essence.


